#### **Lindsey Britt - Vermont**

#### 1) What interests you about participating on the Ad Comm?

I'd like to contribute to NWTRCC because without the organization I probably wouldn't have decided to take on being a tax resister. I'd like to help make NWTRCC more accessible to more people who may not currently see tax resistance as a tool in their environmental, social justice, etc. campaign.

#### 2) What perspectives, skills, or interests would you bring to the Ad Comm?

My perspective is one of a person trying to living compassionately and by the Golden Rule. Tax resistance is part of how I live compassionately, that is my main motivation for adopting this form of resistance. Veganism, animal rights activism, living simply, and nonviolent direct action are other ways that I express this desire to live compassionately. I am also someone who refuses only part of my income tax payment and tries to lives on less to reduce my tax bill, so that may qualify as a "perspective." I'm a believer in taking on what you can handle now and building up to more as you go. I have a lot of administrative skills (website design/maintenance, database management, bookkeeping, graphic design, event planning, etc.) and fundraising experience (appeal writing, grant writing). I also really enjoy brainstorming, teaching, and finding solutions.

#### 3) What would you like to get from participating on the Ad Comm?

I would like to learn more about how a small organization functions and the challenges it faces in meeting its goals and staying on budget. I'd like to work in a small, committed group.

### 4) Please give a brief history of your conscientious objection to war taxes.

I started learning about WTR over five years ago, around the same time I started to try to find ways to reduce the amount of time I spent working at paying jobs so I'd have more time to do the things I enjoy. Without fully embracing and labeling it as war tax resistance, I started lowering my income to reduce my tax liability. In 2020 I refused to pay a portion of my 2019 taxes and will do the same with my 2020 taxes.

#### 5) What other peace and justice work are you or have you been involved in?

I'm interested in so many different issues! For the past several years I've largely focused on climate justice and I've worked on the Fossil-Free SEPTA campaign in Philadelphia with 350Philly, the Power Local Green Jobs campaign in Philadelphia with EQAT, and Rewild Vermont with 350Vermont. I also feel strongly about the death penalty, reproductive rights, animal rights (which I try to connect to my climate justice work), indigenous rights/Land Back,

and refugees (which I also try to connect to my climate justice work), so I've participated in one-off petitions, marches, events, letter writing, etc. related to those issues as well as donating.

# 6) Please briefly tell us something of your vocation and home life.

I'm a nonprofit administrator and fundraising consultant. I also dabble in writing. I live in southern Vermont with my partner, Eric, our dog, Weezie, and our chinchilla, Pedro. I'm an ethical vegan who loves to travel and learning/exploring is my passion.

#### Erica Leigh – Washington State

#### 1) What interests you about participating on the Ad Comm?

Since stepping back from my social media consultant role a few years ago, I've been much less connected to war tax resistance work. I'd like to step back in and contribute where I can!

#### 2) What perspectives, skills, or interests would you bring to the Ad Comm?

I came to NWTRCC at age 24, just a couple years out of college, so I've been that young person NWTRCC has tried to bring in, as well as, now, aging into being a generation removed from today's college students.

I've occupied a lot of different roles within NWTRCC, from AdComm (2009-2011) to paid social media consultant (2013-2018) to member of various committees. I have a fair amount of knowledge about how NWTRCC has worked during that time. At the same time, I do want to continue to push myself and our group to get creative about NWTRCC's role and potential in today's peace and justice movements – understanding our strengths and weaknesses and where to focus.

I've particularly enjoyed writing for NWTRCC: literature, blog posts, project proposals, etc.

#### 3) What would you like to get from participating on the Ad Comm?

I would like to continue to support NWTRCC as an organization and strengthen my connection to the war tax resistance network nationally!

#### 4) Please give a brief history of your conscientious objection to war taxes.

I became a war tax resister after attending NWTRCC's November 2008 conference in Eugene, OR and meeting so many great folks who resist militarism!

I have practiced various forms of resistance over the years, including low-income resistance, reducing/eliminating taxable income through credits and deductions, W-4 resistance, and self-employment. I am currently a W-4 resister earning a regular wage as an employee, with occasional self-employment income.

#### 5) What other peace and justice work are you or have you been involved in?

I rode with Bike4Peace in 2005 from Everett, WA to Rapid City, SD, networking with peace and justice groups and aligned individuals along the way.

I have been doing anti-racist work in the Seattle area since 2012. My work is two-fold: education work with fellow white folks to understand our role in perpetuating and ending racism, and organizing with BIPOC-led groups to end the U.S. immigration detention and deportation

system. I see the violence of migrant detention and deportation as inextricably linked with US and global militarism.

# 6) Please briefly tell us something of your vocation and home life.

I'm a lifelong Seattle resident, currently living with my partner. I've been working primarily as a bike mechanic in a regular waged job for the past 2.5 years, but have held a variety of jobs and self-employment roles.
