



STATEMENT OF TELEPHONE WAR TAX REFUSAL

I refuse to pay the following amount of federal excise tax on this bill because of conscientious objection to its use for military purposes:

The U.S. government spends at least half of all income and excise tax revenues on the costs of wars: past, present, and future. The federal telephone excise tax has a long association with war, since it was first imposed in 1898 during the Spanish-American War. Our taxes should be used to care for life, not to wage war. Those of us who refuse to pay the tax usually redirect it by donating the money to organizations that fund human needs.

I anticipate that these unpaid taxes will be reported to the Internal Revenue Service, as stated in the IRS code (sect. 49.4291-1, title 26; 1996). Please adjust my account with the appropriate credit.
